BI 114 BIBLICAL KINGDOM WORLD VIEW *Pastor Andre Benjamin* 3 credits.

BI 423 ACCESS TO BIBLICAL LANGUAGES *Pastor Avril Vandermerwe* 4 credits

Research tools and resources are presented, discussed and demonstrated that promote further intensive study of the Scriptures utilizing biblical Hebrew and Greek. The student will be motivated to advance in biblical language research skills, understanding the vital usage of the original languages.
