ONLINE CLASSES**LS/GS 207 | RML 654 SPIRITUAL WALK OF THE CHRISTIAN LEADER****Pastor Chris Ward****4 credits**

Before leaders can encourage others to grow spiritually, they must learn how to walk in the ways of God. This online course will help the student understand this principle and provide a better understanding of their daily walk with God.

BI 329 | RBL 620 PAULINE EPISTLES II**Craig Spingath****4 credits**

This online course provides a study of Paul’s epistles written from prison to the churches of Ephesus, Philippi, Colosse, and to Philemon. The background of each book will be studied, as well as their doctrinal emphases and the practical application thereof.

GS 305 | RBL 657 CHURCH HISTORY**Pastor Terry Tarsiuk****4 credits**

This course provides a survey of the significant historical events in the church, from its inception to the present day. Special attention will be given to movements within the church, Pentecostal and revival history, and contemporary phenomena.

PRACTICAL MINISTRY**PM 300 PRACTICAL MINISTRIES****Pastor Chris Ward****1- 3****credits**

Students will engage in 10 – 30 hours of practical ministry in the local community and/or the local church. Students enrolled in an undergraduate academic program at SBC are required to complete on average 30 service hours per year in the local church or a community program.
