#### LS/GS 207 | RML 654 SPIRITUAL WALK OF THE CHRISTIAN LEADER **Pastor Chris Ward** 4 credits

Before leaders can encourage others to grow spiritually, they must learn how to walk in the ways of God. This online course will help the student understand this principle and provide a better understanding of their daily walk with God.

# **BI 329 | RBL 620 PAULINE EPISTLES II**

This online course provides a study of Paul's epistles written from prison to the churches of Ephesus, Philippi, Colosse, and to Philemon. The background of each book will be studied, as well as their doctrinal emphases and the practical application thereof.

# GS 305 | RBL 657 CHURCH HISTORY

This course provides a survey of the significant historical events in the church, from its inception to the present day. Special attention will be given to movements within the church, Pentecostal and revival history, and contemporary phenomena.
