**PT/LS 208 | RML 608 SPIRITUAL WARFARE: LEADERSHIP STRATEGIES**

**PM 300 PRACTICAL MINISTRIES**

Students will engage in 10 – 30 hours of practical ministry in the local community and/or the local church.
