**BI 122 | RBL 662 SCRIPTURE TYPES** **3-4 credits**

This course will help the student to learn the subject of *Types* in the Bible. It will enable the student to understand what types are in the Old Testament and their purpose as well as understand the fulfillment of the types (anti-type) in the New Testament.

**3-4 credits**

Students will have a thorough introduction and overview of the New Testament. Attention is given to the historical and cultural setting of the New Testament writings in order to provide the necessary contexts for understanding the life and ministry of Jesus and of his first followers, and to the careful examination of the theological teaching of the New Testament writings that have shaped the Christian faith.

Students will understand who the Third Person of the Trinity is and understand His purpose and function in the Old and New Testament.

The School of Biblical Entrepreneurship is a 3-4 quarter school that is “designed to teach how to use the Word of God as a guide to exercising stewardship over His resources and to serve others while leading them to Jesus Christ” (Principles of Biblical Entrepreneurship, 15). Such classes include the 12 principles of biblical entrepreneurship; developing the right attitude and character; identifying opportunities; taking risks; and much more.

**ONLINE CLASSES****BI 321 GOSPEL OF JOHN****Dr. Dan C. Hammer****3 credits**

This course offers an in-depth analysis and study of the content and application of the Gospel written by John the Beloved. Special attention is given to the teachings of Jesus and the purpose of the author – “that you may believe.”

**PT 106 | RML 676 LIFESTYLE DISCIPLESHIP****Pastor James Beirne****3-4 credits**

This course is an overview of practical, biblical discipleship. The student will be equipped to understand and practically respond to the command from Jesus for maturing disciples to make disciples.

**GO 102 | RML 660 GLOBAL MISSIONS****Pastor Chris Ward****3-4 credits**

This course presents an overview of the global perspective of Christian missions and is designed to inspire and challenge students concerning worldwide ministry with special emphasis on the biblical and theological foundation for the cross-cultural mandate of missions.

**PRACTICAL MINISTRY****PM 300 PRACTICAL MINISTRIES****Pastor Chris Ward****1- 3 credits**

Students will engage in 10 – 30 hours of practical ministry in the local community and/or the local church. Students enrolled in an undergraduate academic program at SBC are required to complete on average 30 service hours per year in the local church or a community program.
