This course offers an in-depth analysis and study of the content and application of the Gospel written by John the Beloved. Special attention is given to the teachings of Jesus and the purpose of the author – “that you may believe.”

BI 431 | RBL 626 HERMENEUTICS**Dr. Avril Vandermerwe****4 credits****Professor of Record: Deborah Sizer**

This online course is an introduction to the principles of interpreting Scripture. The course lays a foundation for understanding how to interpret the Bible, but just as much emphasizes practice in applying the principles. Further study is made into research tools and resources for the original languages.

BI/LS 313 | RBL 611 NEHEMIAH & LEADERSHIP**Dr. Dan C. Hammer****4 credits**

This online course engages the student in the Biblical text of the Book of Nehemiah, explores the leadership themes and principles contained therein, and discovers areas of practical application for the obedient servant of God.
