In this course, the student will learn what it means to be a prophetic warrior, how to walk in discernment and engage the revelatory for the purpose of intercession. This online course examines the content of the Book of Acts with emphasis upon the work of the Holy Spirit in the establishment of the church and its missionary work.

**BI 319 | RBL 610 BOOK OF ISAIAH****Pastor Terry Tarsiuk****4 credits**

This online course will approach the literary and historical content relating to such themes as Judah's spiritual depravity, God the Holy One of Israel, the Servant, the remnant and God's eschatological plan for the nation's and the world's future as well as its application for us today.

**GO 404 | RML 613 PENTECOST & GLOBAL MISSIONS****Pastor Chris Ward****3 credits | 4 credits**

This course of study examines the importance of the Holy Spirit in Christian missions. From the Day of Pentecost as recorded in Acts 2, to the impact and influence on global missions of the modern Pentecostal movement.
