This course will invite students to join the 3,500-year-old flow of worship presented in the Book of Psalms. We will pray along with ancient believers as they celebrate the greatness of our Covenant-keeping God, lament the troubles of this life, and give thanks for the Lord's faithfulness. We will explore the major themes that unify these 150 poems of praise; discover how they are used in the New Testament, and learn to pray along with the psalmists.
