PT 455 | RML 685 MINISTRY FOR DELIVERANCE Lisa Putnam 4 credits

This course will uncover an often-over-looked ministry need for deliverance within church and secular culture. Freedom is often viewed as a work of the cross but that is the beginning point. Each student will be given language and tools as they discover a biblical approach to deliverance for everyday lives and in the ministry of the church to its community.

BI 407 | RBL 677 II CORINTHIANS Pastor Terry Tarsiuk 4 credits

Students will come to understand the Apostle Paul’s struggles with the church in Corinth. From this letter, students learn to examine their own motives for serving the Lord. They will also learn to be encouraged as believers and to continue in faith and not lose heart, obeying the Lord in all things, understanding that spiritual warfare is real and warning the students of Satan’s tactics.

PT 209 | RML 684 ACTIVATING SPIRITUAL WARFARE Dr. Kathleen M. Troll 3 credits | 4 credits

“If you are a citizen of the kingdom of God through faith in Christ, you are automatically at war with the kingdom of Satan” (Prince, Derek. *Pulling Down Strongholds*, Whitaker House: New Kensington, PA, 2013, p. 8). This course will be a deep dive into what the believer needs to understand about personal and corporate spiritual warfare as demonstrated throughout scripture. Students will exam their own areas of influence and how to deal with the spiritual realm. Fasting, prayer, worship, and journaling will be practiced throughout the 10 weeks of activation. This class will meet 3 times during the quarter for 2 hours; the rest of the course will be completed independently.

TH 353 | RBL 678 THEOLOGY VI: ANGELOLOGY & ESCHATOLOGY 3 credits | 4 credits

In this course students will learn about the created beings of angels, good and evil angels, and the roles they have and their influence over the affairs of those on earth. Also, students will understand the doctrine of last things (eschatology) including the intermediate state, the second advent, the resurrection, the judgment, and the destinies of the evil and the good.

GS 105 | RML 686 SCHOOL OF CREATIVE ARTS: CREATIVE WRITING 3 credits | 4 credits
