BI/LS 313 | RBL 610 NEHEMIAH and LEADERSHIP Dr. Dan C. Hammer 4 credits

This course engages the student in the Biblical text of the Book of Nehemiah, explores the leadership themes and principles contained therein, and discovers areas of practical application for the obedient servant of God.

PT 114-1/RML 672 KINGDOM DESIGN: IDENTITY Debra Thompson 3/4 credits

This course develops the student in their unique identity through discovering their purpose and gifts. The class will focus on the following two areas: personal destiny and personal development.

ONLINE CLASSES (Pre-Recorded)

LS/PT 326/RML 604 SPIRITUAL DEVELOPMENT OF CHRISTIAN LEADERS: Dr. Paul Vallee
Professor of Record: Dr. Kathleen M. Troll 3/4 credits

This online course is designed to help take a leader's own spiritual life to the next level, particularly in the spiritual disciplines. This balanced course will assist the learner to experience the dynamics of his/her spiritual journey from the perspective of an inward, an upward and a corporate discipline in concert with the enabling presence of the Holy Spirit.

BI 327/RBL 618 ROMANS: Bill Whiddon 4 credits

This course engages the student in the biblical text of the Book of Romans explores the various aspects of salvation, faith, sovereignty of God and discovers areas of practical application for the obedient servant of God such as spiritual gifts and service.

BI 120 HOLY SPIRIT IN THE OLD AND NEW TESTAMENT: Lorna Mirador 1 credit

This is a study of the Holy Spirit where students will learn about His person, His work, and His ministry in the life of a believer both in the Old and New Testament.
